SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Odyssey Charter School is a Nevada public school serving students in grades K-12 in the greater Las Vegas area. Odyssey was chartered in 1999 for grades K-8, with grades 9-12 added in 2001 to offer an alternative approach for students who struggled in traditional high schools or needed more flexibility. Since then, Odyssey has expanded its high school program to serve a larger, diverse student body. It operates on a hybrid model where students mainly complete lessons and assignments online under the guidance of a licensed teacher. Currently, 90% of students attend a weekly three-hour face-to-face school day to meet with teachers and receive in-person instruction, while 10% complete only online coursework. Odyssey’s enrollment exceeds 1,400 students. Additionally, Odyssey has enhanced its curriculum by offering Advanced Placement (AP) and dual credit courses—11 AP courses and 12 dual credit courses are available. AP and dual-credit courses require students to attend classes in person for direct instruction. The school is accredited by Cognia.

TESTING

Participation in the ACT with writing is mandatory for graduation in Nevada. For the class of 2026, 440 students took the ACT with writing in March 2024. The average score was 17.17.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Twenty-three credits are required for graduation in the following areas: 4 credits of English, 3 credits of math, 1 credit of world history or geography, 1 credit of U.S. history, 0.5 credit of American government, 0.5 credit of econ and financial literacy, 0.5 credit of health, 2 credits of physical education, 2 credits of science, 2 flex credits, 0.5 credit of computer sci & applications, and 6 credits are allocated for electives. Current juniors and seniors must participate in the ACT with writing. On the students’ transcripts, honors courses are identified with H, dual credit courses are identified as Dual Enrollment with a college course number, and Advanced Placement courses are identified with AP. Students earn 0.5 credit for each semester course completed with a grade of D or above.



ADVANCED DIPLOMA

The Advanced Diploma requires students to complete 24 credits while maintaining a minimum weighted grade point average (GPA) of 3.25. Students must satisfy their graduation requirements, plus earn one additional credit in math and science (with the option to substitute computer science for one), and one additional credit in social studies, arts/humanities, or CTE courses.

COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS DIPLOMA

College and Career Readiness Diploma: Students must complete 24 credits of approved coursework, maintain a 3.25 weighted GPA or higher, and fulfill one of the following requirements: demonstrate proficiency in two languages or complete two credits in AP courses, dual credit courses, CTE courses, Work-Based Learning courses, or a World Language Course. Additionally, students must earn one or both of the following endorsements. The College-Ready endorsement is for students who complete a college readiness assessment and achieve the minimum scores for initial (non-remedial) placement into college-level English and mathematics courses. The Career-Ready endorsement is earned by students who complete the ACT National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC) with a level Silver or higher, score at least 50 on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB), obtain a Career and Technical Education Skills Attainment Certificate, or receive a credential from Nevada's Industry-Recognized Credentials List (OWINN).

WEIGHTED GPA (with bonus points)

Odyssey High School students earn bonus points for completing honors, dual credit, and AP classes. For honors courses, students receive a 0.025 bonus per half credit; for dual credit and AP courses, they earn a 0.05 bonus per half credit. The weighted GPA is capped at 4.95. The student or students with the highest GPA will be named Valedictorian.

AP (AP), Honors (H), and Dual Credit (WNC Dual Credit/CSN Jumpstart)

Odyssey Charter High School offers the following Advanced Placement courses: AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Computer Science Principles, AP English Language and Composition, AP Environmental Science, AP Human Geography, AP Psychology, AP Statistics, AP U.S. Government and Politics, AP U.S. History, and AP World History. The school also provides honors courses including Algebra II H, Biology H, Chemistry H, English 9 H, English 10 H, English 11 H, English 12 H, Geometry H, Geoscience H, Physics H, Precalculus AB H, Spanish II H, Spanish III H, Spanish IV H, American Government H, Econ and Financial Literacy, U.S. History H, and World History H. Dual Credit courses available are ENG 101, ENG 102, ENG 200, Math 124, HIST 101, HIST 102, PSC 101, ECON 100, CRJ 104, SOC 101, COM 101, and ALS 101. These courses are offered through partnerships with the College of Southern Nevada (CSN) and Western Nevada College (WNC).

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Odyssey Charter School uses a standard grade scale: A = 4.0, B = 3.0, C = 2.0, D = 1.0, and F = 0.
